

How to become an Accredited Rider Trainer

An accredited rider trainer is a competency trainer/assessor for the motorbike classes, who is authorised to deliver training through the Queensland Governments Q-Ride motorbike training program administered by the Department of Transport and Main Roads (TMR).

The accreditation is offered only as an “additional authority” where the person already has Queensland driver trainer accreditation for the motorcycle classes.

A person wishing to deliver the Q-Ride motorcycle training program must be:

1. an accredited rider trainer; and
2. a Q-Ride registered service provider or an employee of a Q-Ride registered service provider.

To become an accredited rider trainer the person must:

1. Meet the requirements for accreditation as a rider trainer under the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005* including:
 - Hold a current driver trainer accreditation to provide driver training for a class R motorcycle, or
 - Have completed a Certificate IV qualification in Transport and Logistics (Road Transport Motorcycle Riding Instruction) TLI41410 or TLI41409, and
 - Have completed a Certificate IV qualification in Training and Assessment (TAE40110 or TAA40104), or
 - Have completed Assessment Competency Units, TAEASS401A and TAEASS402A or TAAASS401 and TAAASS402.

2. Lodge an accreditation application form (F3948) in person at a TMR Customer Service Centre. There is no application fee.

The application should be accompanied by:

- the applicant’s current driver licence and industry authority.
- the original Certificate IV qualification (if this certificate has not been previously provided to TMR as an accompanying document to a Driver Trainer Accreditation application)
- the original Certificate IV qualification in Training and Assessment or Assessment Competency Units.

Accredited rider trainer applicants are subject to criminal and traffic offence history checks to determine suitability.

If the application is approved, the person will be issued with a new industry authority . This card must be displayed when the rider trainer gives Q-Ride training.

The rider trainer must also comply with the *Statutory Accreditation Conditions for Accredited Driver Trainers and Rider Trainers* and the *Code of Conduct for Queensland Accredited Driver Trainers* available on the TMR website www.tmr.qld.gov.au or [refer to the *Transport Operations (Road Use Management – Accreditation and Other Provisions) Regulation 2005*].

A contravention of these conditions may result in TMR amending, suspending or cancelling the person’s accreditation.
