


# Application for renewal of a permanent identification device (PID) registry Licence

*Animal Management (Cats and Dogs) Act 2008  
Section 155*

This form may be used to apply for the renewal of a permanent identification device (PID) registry licence (Licence). If the Chief Executive decides to renew the Licence, the Chief Executive may impose additional conditions on the Licence not inconsistent with the mandatory conditions.

If the Chief Executive refuses to renew the Licence, or imposes conditions on the Licence, the Chief Executive must give the applicant an information notice for the decision.

The Chief Executive may, by notice, require the Licence holder to provide further information or documentation reasonably required to decide the application. A reasonable time period of at least 28 days will be stated in the notice for the applicant to comply.

If the applicant does not comply with the requirement within the stated period in the notice, the applicant will be taken to have withdrawn their application.
